

BOATING SAFETY

Start of the Boating Season

Spring comes and we prepare our boats for a safe summer season.

Does your boat have all the US Coast Guard required equipment in board?



- Sound producing devices: make sure all horns, bells and whistles are in working order.
- Fire extinguishers need to be charged, the right type, size and quantity for your boat.
- Navigational lights must be in working order.
- Visual Distress Signals: flares must have current expiration dates and you must have enough for your boat.
- Registration numbers must be displayed properly on your boat.
- The original registration must be kept on the boat, photo copies are not acceptable.

Check your remaining equipment, navigational equipment, batteries, etc. Are they in good working order? Is your first aid kit well equipped and do you know how to use it in an emergency?

Review equipment and procedures for emergencies! Prepare for an enjoyable and safe summer!

STAR GAZING

This month the moons first waxing quarter was in the 2nd. The full moon on the 9th, known as the "Pink Moon" because an early spring flower called "Moss Pink" is starting to bloom. The last waning quarter will be on the 17th and the last waning crescent will be on the 24th, the new moon will be on the 25th.



No periodic comets are expected this month. On the night of the 22nd the annual Lyrid Meteor Shower will peak between midnight and dawn. Look to the Northeast to the right of the Constellation Lyra just above the bright blue-white star Vega. The waning crescent moon will be slight distraction but the Lyrids are usually very bright with long tails, expect 10 to 20 meteors per hour at peak, but for a night or two before and after the 22nd there should be a decent sprinkling of "shooting stars".


This shower is the result of the Earth's journey around the Sun passing thru a dust trail of a comet known as "Thatcher" that passed our way in 1861. The Lyrids are the oldest meteor shower record, first recorded in 687 B.C..



The planets Jupiter, Mars, and Venus are early morning objects this month. Jupiter and the Red Planet Mars will be above the horizon in the east-southeast. On the 22nd, Mars and the crescent Moon will be very close to each other. After the 10th, Venus will be exceedingly bright, shining at a –4.4 magnitude for about an hour before sunrise in the east.

Saturn and Mercury are evening objects. Saturn is the bright yellowish object moving thru the constellation Leo this month high in the southern sky and will set before midnight by months end.

On the 26th there will be a neat sight in the sky 30 minutes after sunset. At an altitude of 13° above the horizon in the west-northwest sky the planet Mercury (the closet planet to our Sun) reaches its greatest angle away from the Sun and its peak visibility from Earth. This only happens a few times a year, Mercury is a bit hard to locate. However, this month Mother Nature is going to make finding Mercury easy by placing the crescent Moon about two and a half finger widths held at arms length above the planet.





Look between these two celestial objects and you will see the Pleiades star cluster. This event should be visible with the naked eye, but for the best view use binoculars.
